3. BLESSING OF THE SICK WITH THE RELIC OF ST. ANTHONY



(HAND EXTENDED) They shall lay hands upon the sick and they shall be cured. May Jesus, the Son of Mary, the Lord and Savior of the world, be merciful and propitious to you, through the merits of blessed Anthony. Amen.

May all sickness be removed through the imposition of my hands, especially through the invocation of all the Holy Angels, Archangels, Patriarchs, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Virgins, and all the Saints together, and may we be helped through their merits and prayers. May Jesus Christ be with you, to defend you: May He be within you, to preserve you; May He be before you, to lead you; May He be behind you, to guard you; May He be above you, to bless you; Who with the Father and the Holy Spirit Lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen.

Through the intercession of the most Blessed Virgin Mary and of blessed Anthony, may God, in His most tender mercy, deliver you from your present infirmity and from all ills of mind and body, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

SAINT ANTHONY'S BREAD

It is the custom of giving bread to the poor when a prayer to St. Anthony has been answered.

Pope Leo XIII, in his letter of 1898 on the Thirteen Tuesdays, commended the practice of giving "St. Anthony's Bread" to the needy.

St. Anthony of Padua

Born in Lisbon, Portugal in 1195, he was given the name Fernando. In 1220 he joined the Augustinian Monks. His life changed when he witnessed the bodies of the first Franciscan martyrs, who had been killed preaching the faith in Morocco, brought back to Europe. Fernando greatly desired to follow in their footsteps. Inspired by their courage and love for Jesus Christ, he joined the Franciscans and his name was changed to Anthony.

His first assignment as a friar was as a missionary to the Muslims in Morocco. When he arrived there he became seriously ill and was forced to return to Europe. En route, his ship was hit by a fierce storm and Anthony landed in Italy, where he would spend the rest of his life. Recognized as a gifted preacher and teacher, St. Anthony drew great crowds everywhere, especially in the city of Padua. He challenged people to care for the poor, and he spoke out about injustices in society.

Anthony had true compassion for everyone. He emphasized God's love as unfailing and never-ending. He encouraged people to repentance and sacrifice in their lives. He was patient in trial, humble about his own talents, and genuinely enthusiastic in sharing his faith.

He was widely known for his holiness and great devotion to our Blessed Mother. Tradition says that Mary rewarded him by presenting the Infant Jesus to hold in his arms.

During his lifetime, St. Anthony performed many miracles to help the sick and the poor. After living the last years of his life ill and in terrible pain, he died on June 13, 1231, at the age of 36. Through the centuries so many miracles have been attributed to him that he is called "The Miracle Worker." His feast day is June 13^{th.}

NOVENA TO ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

The word "NOVENA" comes from Latin and means "nine each." It refers to prayers offered over a nine-day period. This novena prayer above to St. Anthony can be prayed over nine consecutive days.
