

Preparation for Mass with the Scriptural praying of the Servite Rosary of the Seven Sorrows is also encouraged.



ABOUT THE INTERNATIONAL COMPASSION MINISTRY (ICM)



The International Compassion Ministry (ICM) was founded by Fr. Peter Mary Rookey, O.S.M. Father Peter's gift of healing first became apparent during his assignment at Our Lady of Benburb College, County Tyrone, Northern Ireland which began in 1948. His ensuing part-time ministry of healing was interrupted, starting in 1953, due to a lengthy series of reassignments. It was not until many years later that circumstances allowed him to resume a healing ministry with the 1987 founding of ICM at the Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrows in Chicago, Illinois.

The ICM is essentially a ministry of prayer and compassion. Any resulting healing is done by the Lord, and any other forms of assistance would be secondary and incidental. The ICM serves all people who seek prayers, regardless of their beliefs or religious affiliation. From the ministry's beginning, people have also been able to request prayer by phone and by mail at:

BIOGRAPHY OF FATHER PETER MARY ROOKEY, OSM

*Peter Rookey was born October 12, 1916, at Superior, Wisconsin, the ninth of 9 sons and 4 daughters of Anthony and Johanna (nee McGarry) Rookey, a family of great Catholic faith. As a boy, he and his brother Bernard, one fourth of July, were walking down the street when they spied a firecracker on the ground. The boys picked up the firecracker and touched a match to it. The firecracker did not explode. So Peter brought the firecracker close to his face and breathed on it. The firecracker blew up in his face, blinding Peter completely. As the doctor pulled the debris from the boy's eyes, he told the mother that young Peter would never see again. Peter heard his mother reply, "We'll see about that. From today on we'll say the Rosary especially for your healing." As the family prayed the Rosary, Peter felt the wish to become a priest. Fearing that he would not be accepted into a seminary because he could neither read nor study, Peter prayed that his eyesight would be restored in order for him to study for the priesthood. Through praying the Rosary, Peter's eyesight was miraculously restored.

Completing grade school, at the age of 13, Peter went from his home in Superior, Wisconsin and entered the Servite Order on September 8, 1930 at the Mater Dolorosa Seminary of the Order of Servants of Mary in Hillside, Illinois, a suburb of Chicago. From there, he entered the Servite Novitiate in Granville, Wisconsin on September 9, 1934. Peter professed solemn vows as a Servite on November 1, 1938, and was ordained a priest on May 17, 1941 at Our Lady of Sorrows Church in Chicago, Illinois. Father Peter then spent time in Wisconsin as well as in Oregon and the Hillside, Illinois seminary before joining Father James Mary Keane and five other Servites to begin the Order of Servants of Mary in Benburb County, Tyrone, Ireland. It was in Ireland in 1948 that Father Rookey received two gifts from GOD: The gift of healing and exorcism; and the gift of seeing (almost daily, he told us) the Face of JESUS in the Eucharistic Host consecrated at the Masses he offered. Father Rookey directed Benburb College for nearly three years, then was elected, in 1953, to Assistant General of the worldwide Servite Order until 1959. Father Rookey's knowledge of seven languages (English, Latin, French, Spanish, German, Flemish, and Italian) helped him work for the betterment of the Servite Order. While stationed in Rome, Father Rookey worked successfully to obtain from Pope Pius XII the status of Basilica for Our Lady of Sorrows Servite church in Chicago.

From 1959 to 1961 Father Rookey was a professor/director of the Catholic University of Louvain in Belgium, he then worked in the Servite parish of the Assumption in Germany until 1968.

In 1968 Father Rookey came back to the United States. For 16 years he was assigned to four mission churches in the Missouri Ozarks. He then finally returned to his place of ordination, the Basilica of Our Lady of Sorrows where he served from 1985 to 1989.

In 1989 Father Rookey began the International Compassion Ministry, for compassionate service and healing. The Ministry was located in the Chicago suburb of Olympia Fields, Illinois until October, 2013, when Father Rookey was ordered to return to the priory at Our Lady of Sorrows Basilica in Chicago. From there until his death on September 10, 2014, Father Rookey continued his ministry of healing through phone calls and letters.

Among other honors, Father Rookey was a member of the 4th Degree Knights of Columbus, and designated by Pope John Paul II as a Knight of the Holy Sepulchre.

Father Rookey fasted daily throughout most of his life. The rosary was always in his hands, the beads gently slipping through those blessed fingers. Holy Mass, Adoration, and prayer were his constant companions and weapons against the evil ones. Hundreds of thousands of people were affected by this Apostle of Compassion.
