A souls time in purgatory consists of suffering and hope. Hope for the end of their suffering, while the flames they endure cleanses and purifies them, so that they may enter the kingdom of God which is all holy and pure. Even though there is real suffering from the flames, the greatest suffering for these souls comes from being separated from God. It is this waiting to be re-united with God that makes the souls in purgatory eager for our prayers.

Souls in purgatory cannot any longer help themselves. They are totally dependant on those on earth to pray for them. It is our prayers that relieve their sufferings and reduces our own time in purgatory. This is the greatest act of **charity** that you can do for your neighbor, that is, helping someone who can no longer help himself.

We are living for the souls, we are apostles, let us save above all the souls of Priests. These souls should be more transparent than crystal. Alas, how many unworthy priests there are, how many priests who are not holy enough! We pray, we suffer for them and, on the last day, Jesus will be grateful" (LT 94)." Saint Thérése of Lisieux


