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NOVENA TO MARIA BAMBINA

May be recited on any nine consecutive days



Novena

The word Novena derives it name from the Latin word "novem" meaning "nine." A novena can be either a private or public devotion in the Catholic Church to obtain special graces.

Introduction

The Italian words "Maria Bambina" mean "Baby Mary." Although the Holy Childhood of the Blessed Virgin, under the image of Our Lady as an infant, is honored in Mexico, Poland and Italy, relatively few Catholics in the United States know of this devotion. Several saints, including St. John Eudes, St. Joseph Cupertino and St. Padre Pio loved to contemplate the Blessed Mother as a baby. Reflecting on Our Blessed Mother as an infant and child will enrich your love and devotion to her as it did for these saints. As the perfect disciple of Jesus Christ, Our blessed Mother imitated Our Lord in all of His virtues. She imitated, in advance, the virtues of Our Lord's Holy Childhood.

Reflecting upon a likeness of the Child Mary is one of the many rich fruits of Franciscan spirituality. St. Francis is credited with preparing the first Christmas Crèche and with popularizing the Stations of the Cross. This great saint understood that holy images could be used as teaching tools that could stimulate the soul to a greater love of God. This is the beloved image of Maria Bambina venerated at the Convent of the Sisters of Charity in Milan, Italy. Simply gazing upon this charming image of Our Blessed Mother as a baby moves the heart to a great tenderness for our Heavenly Mother. Great numbers of the faithful come to the Convent of Maria Bambina in Milan to bring their petitions to the Child Mary. Particularly, couples, who are having difficulty conceiving often come there to pray for the gift of a baby. Many later return to the convent with their newborns to thank Maria Bambina for having answered their prayers.

The earliest document commemorating the feast of The Nativity of the Mother of God comes from the sixth century. St. Romanus, the great ecclesiastical lyricist of the Greek Church, composed a hymn for the feast ("Hymnogr. Graeca") which is a poetical sketch of the apocryphal Gospel of St. James.

The devotion to Maria Bambina in the city of Milan can be traced back to 1007, the year in which the church of Santa Maria Fulcorina was dedicated to the "Mystery of the Nativity of Mary." Eventually the church became the Cathedral Church of Milan, Saint Mary Major. In 1251 Pope Innocent IV granted in perpetuity a plenary indulgence for those who visit the Cathedral on the feast day of Mary's Nativity (September 8th). From this time on, Mary's birthday was celebrated with great solemnity. A new and more beautiful church was built whose high altar, Pope Martin V consecrated in 1418. The present <u>Duomo</u> (Italian for cathedral) was consecrated more than 100 years later in 1572 by St. Charles Borromeo who dedicated it officially

in honor of the Birth of Mary. Over the main entrance of the cathedral are the words in bronze letters: "Mariae Nascenti," meaning, " birth of Mary." (The tomb of St. Charles Borromeo is in the crypt of the Duomo.)

Hail, admirable Child Mary, Mystical Rose, closed garden, open only to the heavenly Spouse. O Lily of paradise, make me love the humble and hidden life;

Holy Child Mary, mystical dawn, gate of heaven, you are my trust and hope. O powerful advocate, from your cradle stretch out your hand, support me on the path of life. Make me serve God with ardor and constancy until death and so reach an eternity with you. Hail Mary, full of grace.....
