Anthony of Padua

Born in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal, the future St. Anthony of Padua was the son of a knight at the court of King Alfonso II. He studied as a youth under the priests of the Lisbon cathedral and was ordained. He joined the Franciscans in 1221.

His sermons, noted for their eloquence, spirit and persuasiveness, attracted huge crowds everywhere he preached. His success in reconciling persons alienated from the Church and as a confessor was phenomenal. He settled in Padua, Italy after 1226, and worked to abolish debtors' prisons, helped the poor and worked ceaselessly and untiringly to teach authentic Catholic doctrine. He died in 1231, at the age of 36. He was canonized a saint the following year and declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946. He is known as the "Wonder Worker".
