#### **ANOTHER EXPERIENCE**

First of all, *every one* of us encountered a rather strong reason not to come to that prayer meeting, but at the last moment, each one of us experienced a change of mind. At the beginning of the meeting, we discussed it and laughed about it. It had never happened before.

During the course of that meeting, other things happened, which made us realize that this *was not* an ordinary night.

Then, at the end of the meeting, the hostess read aloud a randomly selected prayer. It was as follows:

## Prayer to the Holy Spirit

#### Come Holy Spirit.

Replace the tension within us with a holy relaxation. Replace the turbulence within us with a sacred calm. Replace the anxiety within us with a quiet confidence. Replace the fear within us with a strong faith. Replace the bitterness within us with the sweetness of grace. Replace the darkness within us with a gentle light. Replace the coldness within us with a loving warmth. Replace the night within us with a loving warmth. Replace the winter within us with Your light. Replace the winter within us with Your Spring. Straighten our crookedness. Fill our emptiness. Light the fires of our love. Quench the flames of our lust. Dull the edge of our pride. Sharpen the edge of our humility.

#### A SHORT SPIRITUAL EXERCISE
